Many of our favorite movies, from Toy Story to Moana, tell the stories of characters who are on a journey to discover who they are and what they were created to do. What it is: With notifications, texts, and social media always beckoning, teens and adults are looking for a way to send the message that they're "<u>not available</u>" (*language*).

Why this thing has legs: If we've learned anything from the pandemic restrictions over the past year, it might be this: Being online gets old! While screens continue to be the main source of social interaction for kids who are remote learning, socialization via smartphones can easily become exhausting. And now that notices of *all* of our obligations come through our handheld devices, people of all ages are looking for ways to "politely disconnect." We suspect that some forward-thinking app developers will be working on a new auto-reply feature, which can respond to any and all notifications with an "away" message - circa the heyday of AOL Instant Messenger.
