

I've been to a couple funerals in the last month, and it's made me reflect on some things about myself, while I feel like I've still got a long life ahead of me, I know we are never promised tomorrow. I was really impressed with the things that people said about the 2 men that had passed. They were both men of God. 1 of them was a preacher, and even during a pandemic, it seemed like several hundred people were present to remember and honor the life he lived. The second lived a less public life, but was still very outspoken about his faith. His was a much smaller gathering, but he was the father of a good friend of mine, so I think his service definitely impacted me more. These men had friends and family speaking at their funerals about their love for Jesus, and the many ways that they had lived their lives in a way that honored God.

The thing that I realized during these services, is that if I did die tomorrow, I don't know what would be said at my funeral. I've definitely made some changes to my priorities in recent months, and feel like I am getting closer to being on the path God has for me. But I'm 35 years old, and I feel like I've spent the majority of the first half of my life focused on myself. We're supposed to be focused on God's kingdom, not our own, and if I have another 35 years left, the second half of my life is going to reflect that.

A big part of that for me, is going to be how I treat, and think about, other people. If you're active on Facebook, there is a group called Gracecommunity Caremongers, where various needs are posted, not just for people that come to our church, but people from our community as well. I'd encourage you to check it out, whether you're looking for new ways to help, or needing some help yourself, it's a great group of people.
